

Did you know?

- Come discover some of the most common types of water pollution
- Learn more about our City's MS4 permit issued under authority of the State of Florida Environmental Protection Agency
- Discuss what can be done and where we can play the largest role in protecting our waters from pollution
- Opportunities will be available to get involved in the Deltona Stormwater Management Program

- ◆ Stormwater Runoff is considered the State's leading cause of water pollution
- ◆ The first inch of rain carries 90% of the pollutants from homes, yards, and streets
- ◆ Stormwater contributes about 80% of the heavy metals that enter Florida's Waterways. Examples of these metals are: Lead, Arsenic, and Mercury
- ◆ Fertilizer from Residential use totals 1/3 the excess nitrogen polluting our waterways
- ◆ At least 50% of water quality problems in the U.S. result from these types of NPS Pollution
