1. CALL TO ORDER:

The meeting was called to order at 5:30 p.m. by Mayor Masiarczyk.

2. ROLL CALL – CITY CLERK:

3. PLEDGE TO THE FLAG:

The City Commission and staff said the pledge to the flag.

PUBLIC COMMENTS: – Citizen comments limited to items not on the agenda and comments on items listed on the agenda will take place after discussion of each item.

Mayor Masiarczyk opened and closed the meeting for public comments as there were none.

4. BUSINESS:

- A. **Discussion regarding Ordinance No. 16-2016, amending Sec. 38-116, “Notice to Correct Violation” providing for 24 hour posting before abatement of repeat nuisance - Becky Vose, Legal Department (407) 448-0111**

Strategic Goal: Public Safety - strengthen code enforcement.

City Attorney Vose explained Ordinance No. 16-2016.

The Commission discussed the length of the notice and repeat offenders.

After discussion, the Commission concurred to move forward with Ordinance No. 16-2016.

City Manager Shang proposed discussing item 4-D next and the Commission concurred.

D. Discussion regarding Ordinance No. 19-2016, amending Sec. 38-34 through 38-39, "Solid Waste Violation Notices" providing for Solid Waste Tickets and procedures - Becky Vose, Legal Department (407) 448-0111

Strategic Goal: Public Safety - strengthen code enforcement.

City Attorney Vose gave a brief introduction and explanation of Ordinance No. 19-2016.

The Commission and staff discussed the fees of the Ordinance, Code Enforcement Officers knowing if a resident has called for a bulk pick-up, who monitors the Ordinance, garbage lids being not properly closed, fines for violating the Ordinance, the cost for a garbage can, bulk waste and adopting the fines by resolution.

City Manager Shang discussed keeping the fines for bulk waste and excessive trash on the curb.

City Attorney Vose discussed illegal dumping due to not picking up the trash due to violations.

The Commission discussed illegal dumping, unlimited pick-ups, the contract with Waste Pro, curtid trucks, the implementation date being June 1st, fines and education.

After discussion, the Commission concurred to fine for placing bulk trash out without prior calling for a pick-up and excessive amount of material at the curb.

Deputy City Manager Dale Baker discussed the cost of the tickets versus abating the property and the type of tickets.

The Commission and staff discussed abatement, the current process for bulk waste and the cost of the tickets.

After discussion, the Commission concurred to continue education and have staff discuss if ticketing or a 24 hour abatement was better.

Mayor Masiarczyk opened the meeting for public comments.

Larry Kent, 235 River Village Drive, DeBary, discussed education, tickets and pushing the implementation date back.

Mayor Masiarczyk closed the meeting for public comments.

B. Presentation and discussion of various health insurance models - Cara Burgess, Human Resources (386) 878-8753.

Strategic Goal: On-going projects & Other Priority Objectives Identified - Health Insurance Alternative Access

Human Resources Manager Cara Burgess explained health insurance models, the current City health insurance plan, Deltona's insurance premium history and she introduced Broker of Records Gene Gizzi.

Mr. Gizzi discussed the premium percent, self-insured, fully insured, the 2014 staff review, risk tolerance, the 2016 staff review, off-site clinics, DeLand's health insurance plan, clinic operating costs, partnering with DeLand or Sanford, dependent eligibility verification audits and wellness programs.

The Commission discussed Mr. Gizzi's possible conflict of interest, self insured, off-site clinics, on-site clinics, the City covering 50% of insurance on the family plan, benefits for employees, the salary study, the Employee Insurance Committee, insurance changes with the bargaining unit and workmans compensation.

Commissioner Soukup introduced Dr. Hill who presented a health care proposal and explained the rising cost of health care, the three (3) bucket rule, pre-employment screening, workers compensation, health insurance, the City's insurance coverage, the top reasons for visits to the doctor, emergency room visits and different insurance models.

The Commission discussed different types of medication, workmans compensation and the process to place something on an agenda.

After discussion, the Commission concurred to receive more information on health insurance options.

The Commission and staff discussed advertising for a Request for Proposal (RFP), the next step in the process, the different insurance models, staff's recommendation and the Employee Insurance Committee.

After discussion, the Commission concurred to move forward with staff's recommendation, have the Employee Insurance Committee meet before it is brought to the Commission again and to give another option before the RFP.

C. Discussion regarding possible ordinance regulating drivers of vehicles for hire. Becky Vose, Legal Department, (407-448-0111)
