## Several seats open for Nov. election

**T**HE MAYOR AND THREE City Commission seats will be decided in the upcoming fall elections. The 2010 election schedule provides for a Primary Election on Aug. 24 and a General Election on Nov. 2.

The Mayor and each Commission seat is a four-year term of office. This Fall's election will include the Mayor and Commission Districts 1, 3 and 5 which are currently filled by Mayor Dennis Mulder, Commissioner Zenaida Denizac (1), Vice Mayor Michelle McFall-Conte (3) and Commissioner Janet Deyette (5).



The Primary Election on Aug. 24 applies to the Mayor and Commission seats only if there are more than two candidates for any one of the seats. At presstime, there were four candidates in the process of qualifying for Mayor, two candidates for District 1, four candidates for District 5 and no candidates qualifying for the District 3 Commission seat.

Nominating Petition forms must be submitted by noon, May 24 (21 days prior to the first day of the qualifying period). All necessary forms are contained in the 2010 Municipal Elections Qualifying Packet, available at the Deltona City Clerk's Office. Specific forms within this packet must be signed and completed before the City Clerk during the City's Qualifying Period scheduled in accordance with the Volusia County Uniform Election law beginning at noon, June 14 and ending at noon, June 18.

The City Clerk's Office encourages all eligible residents to register to vote for the candidate of their choice. Deltona is the largest city in Volusia County with a population of 84,264. This includes a total of 51,597 registered voters. Let's show the rest of the 15 Volusia County cities our community spirit by going to the polls on Election Day.



## Hurricane season is approaching, Is your family prepared?

**D**ISASTERS CAN HAPPEN AT ANY TIME AND with the onset of hurricane season, its the perfect time for you and your family to begin to prepare or to review plans for a disaster whether it be flooding, tornadoes or hurricanes. Hurricane season begins in June and getting prepared is key to survival should an active season be in our future.



There are things that you can do throughout the year as well as prior to hurricane season to protect you and your family. One of the most important things to do is to discuss and develop a family action plan. Get everyone involved and discuss disasters and how you can prepare and respond to them. Discuss what your family would do if advised to evacuate and practice what you discuss.

Plan how your family will stay in contact if separated by disaster. Pick two meeting places. 1) A location a safe distance from your home in case of fire. 2) A place outside your neighborhood in case you can't return home. Choose an out-of-state friend as a "check-in contact" for everyone to call.

Next, complete these steps; post emergency telephone numbers by every phone. Show responsible family members how and when to shut off water, gas and electricity at main

switches. Install a smoke detector on each level of your home. Contact your local fire department to learn about home fire hazards. Learn first aid and CPR.

Meet with your neighbors. Plan how the neighborhood could work together after a disaster. Know your neighbors' skills (medical, technical). Consider how you could help neighbors who have special needs, such as elderly or disabled persons. Make

plans for childcare in case parents can't get home.

Deltona has several emergency shelters that are activated as needed during a disaster. The risk shelters for hurricane events are opened on an as needed basis. Not all shelters are opened during an emergency. Be sure to check with Emergency Management officials, or your local radio station to be sure of what to do prior to and during an emergency.

## First car wash underway on Howland

COMMISSIONERS HELPED THE developer of Deltona's first car wash break ground at 3119 Howland Boulevard.

Construction of the Top Shelf Car Wash, set to open this summer, is well underway. The car wash is designed to be revolutionary in the way it recycles and reuses water and will have automated and full service options. The Mayor, Commissioners Janet

Deyette, and Michael Carmolingo along with Robert Desmond from the Economic Development Advisory Board were present for the ground-breaking. The landscape and building design is set to be a "Key West" style with palm trees.

The City hopes this project will be one of many commercial projects happening in the near future along the Howland Boulevard corridor.



### Annual Spruce Up time of cleaning, pride

EACH YEAR THE CITY OF DELTONA SPONSORS A SPECIAL time of cleaning and community pride called Spruce Up. It's a time where everyone is encouraged to get involved in cleaning up yards and discarding any unneeded items around your home and taking them to our Spruce Up receptacles.

Officially, Spruce Up begins at 8 a.m., April 23 and ends at 2 p.m. on April 25. Dumpsters will be placed at 2392 Day Road. Debris may be taken there from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m., April 23; from 8 a.m. to 3 p.m., April 24, and from 8 a.m. to 2 p.m., April 25. Please do not place tires, motor oil, auto parts, paint, hazardous materials, pool chemicals or large appliances in or near the dumpsters. These items should be taken to the West Volusia Transfer Station, 3151 E. New York Ave, DeLand. The station is open from 7 a.m. to 5 p.m., Monday through Friday and from 8 a.m. to 3 p.m., Saturday. There is a West Volusia hazardous amnesty day happening from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m., April 24, at the DeBary Town Hall, 12 Colomba Road.

Spruce Up is an annual event designed to improve the appearance of the City. Its success depends on participation and support by Deltona residents and business. Everyone is asked to improve the general appearance of their homes and properties by trimming shrubbery, mowing grass and planting flowers or shrubs, cleaning, repairing or painting exterior surfaces of homes and buildings (walls, porches, gutters, roofs, pools, etc.), disposing of leaves and branches, accumulated debris and unwanted items stored in carports or elsewhere.

The neighbors on your street could collectively decide to adopt a vacant lot on the street and clean the right of way. ### Say 'Thanks' during National Police Week

Every day on the job, law enforcement officers deal with situations that most could never imagine. These brave men and women risk their lives to uphold the oath they took to protect and serve, and danger and sacrifice become a way of life for those who wear the badge. When a law enforcement officer leaves for a duty assignment and tells their family goodnight, there's no guarantee they will make it home. It was for that reason that President John F. Kennedy and the U.S. Congress established National Police Week in 1962 as a way of honoring those brave officers who lost their lives in the line of duty.

National Police Week takes place every year during the week in which May 15 falls. The week is designed as a special remembrance and recognition of law enforcement officers who paid the ultimate sacrifice while in service protecting others. While ceremonies are held across the country, the main one takes place in Washington, DC. One of the biggest of this year's events will be the 22nd annual Candlelight Vigil, which is expected to draw up to 20,000 people. During this event, candles will be raised for fallen officers and the names of newly-engraved names on the walls will be read aloud.

Last year, the City of Deltona honored the law enforcement community and Mayor Dennis Mulder presented Sheriff Ben Johnson with a proclamation declaring the week of May 10-16 as National Police Week.

Today's society provides unique challenges for law enforcement officers. Imagine for one moment that while at work, you were yelled at, spat on, punched, kicked, shot at, assigned watch over a deceased family killed by a drunk driver or faced with the split-second decision of whether to take another human being's life. Law enforcement officers face many of these things on a daily basis. Remember this: Law enforcement officers put themselves at risk of not making it home so you can. Take a moment and thank the next officer you encounter: Your life or the life of someone you love might depend on them.



