

The event begins at 6 p.m., April 11 at the Dewey O. Boster Sports Complex. Area cancer survivors and fighters will take the first lap around the track.

## Election season already underway in City Clerk's Office

**D**ELTONA RESIDENTS WILL GO TO THE POLLS THIS Fall and decide who will serve as our City's Mayor and decide three Commission seats. This year's election schedule provides for a Primary Election (if needed) on Aug. 26 and a General Election on Nov. 4.

All of the seats for Mayor and Commission are four-year terms of office with a limit of two consecutive terms. The current Mayor seat is held by John Masiarczyk and the three Commissioners whose terms are up are Zenaida Denizac (District 1), Vice Mayor Heidi Herzberg (District 3) and Fred Lowry (District 5).

Aug 26th's Primary is necessary when there are more than two candidates vying for the same seat. Nominating petitions must be submitted by noon, May 19, 28 days prior to the first day of the qualifying period. All necessary forms are available in the 2014 Municipal Election Qualifying Packet available in the City Clerk's Office at City Hall, 2345 Providence Blvd. Nominating petition signatures or a qualifying fee of \$264.10 are required to qualify. To

avoid the fee, candidates are required to collect the signatures of 100 registered voters within the Commission District they are seeking. The qualifying period is from 9 a.m., June 16, through noon, June 20.

Early Primary Election voting is from 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m., Aug. 16-23, at the Deltona Regional Library, 2150 Eustace Ave., and other places in Volusia County. Early General Election voting is from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m., Oct. 25 to Nov. 1, in the same locations. For more information, visit [volusiaelections.org](http://volusiaelections.org).

## Spruce Up Deltona, City's Annual Spring Cleanup Chance for Community Pride

**B**EEN MEANING TO CLEAN OUT THE GARAGE? OR REPLACE THAT SHRUB that's not adding anything to the landscape? Use Spruce Up 2014 as the reason for finally tackling that project around the house.

The City's annual Spring cleanup is officially April 12-13. The City is providing large dumpsters for trash and unwanted items at 2391 Day Road (near the U.S. Post Office on Howland Boulevard). Items may be taken to the trash site from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m., Saturday, and from 8 a.m. to 2 p.m., Sunday. Please do not leave tires, motor oil, auto parts, paint, hazardous materials, pool chemicals or large appliances. Some of these items may be taken to Volusia County's Household Hazardous Waste Collection Event going on from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m., April 12, at 16 Colomba Road, DeBary. They will accept solvents, auto batteries, household batteries, pool chemicals, pesticides, motor oil, gasoline, old paint, up to 10 fluorescent lamps, other household chemicals but will not accept tires.

Residents are encouraged to involve their neighborhoods and clean up their yards, throw away unwanted items and plant flowers—especially azaleas, Deltona's official City flower.

Suggested tasks include trimming and mowing grasses and shrubs;

planting shrubs; cleaning and repairing or painting exterior surfaces of homes and buildings including walls, porches, gutters, roofs and pools; disposing of leaves

and branches, accumulated debris, and unneeded items stored in carports or elsewhere; adopting the vacant lot next door or nearby and cleaning the right-of-way, and joining an adopt-a-street program to keep your street or block looking sharp year-round.

This is a great chance to show community pride by helping us Spruce Up Deltona! Improving the appearance of your property improves property values, reduces crime and goes a long way in helping us work together for a better and more beautiful Deltona.



# Homes available for very low income families

**T**HE CITY'S NEIGHBORHOOD STABILIZATION PROGRAM (NSP) HAS BEEN operational since 2009 and has placed families and individuals in over 60 homes throughout Deltona. One of the requirements of the program is to ensure that every income level is included.

The U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) awards the program and requires that 25 percent of the total program amount be reserved for people considered within the Very Low Income range. The remainder of the homes available in the program are slated for very low income families. Assistance up to 40 percent of the cost of a home is available to those who qualify.

The application includes a list of required documentation required for all members of a household and documentation needed

for proof of income. Applicants must also have a letter of approval from a lender. Applications are available at City Hall, 2345 Providence Blvd., and online at DeltonaFl.Gov. City staff is unable to determine program eligibility until they receive a completed application with all necessary documentation.

The Central Florida Community Development Corporation is available to work with potential homeowners with credit issues. A \$20 fee is required for their services but can be credited back to those going through the closing process on an NSP home.

# Fire Department staff offer life saving skill classes

**H**EALTHCARE PROVIDERS AND LAYPEOPLE CAN TAKE ADVANTAGE OF training that provides them with the skills to save a life. Deltona Fire Department personnel will teach American Heart Association (AHA) Basic Life Support (BLS) and Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation (CPR) at Fire Station #65, 2983 Howland Blvd.

Morning sessions for BLS are for healthcare providers. The BLS course demonstrates skills needed to recognize life-threatening emergencies, provide CPR, use an Automated External Defibrillator (AED) and relieve choking in a safe, timely and effective manner. The course is for those who need to know how to perform CPR and other lifesaving skills in a wide variety of in-hospital and out-of-hospital settings.

The afternoon sessions focus on American Safety & Health Institute's (ASHI) combined CPR and AED program designed specifically for laypeople. The training is excellent for those that

don't work in healthcare but who are required to, or desire to have skills for emergency response to use at home or work. The training is very beneficial for school bus drivers, those that work in senior adult care, child care, teachers and babysitters.

The next BLS classes are from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m., April 19 and June 21. The next CPR recertification classes are from 1 to 3 p.m., April 19 and June 21. Cost for the morning BLS session is \$50 and includes a book, mask, and a 2-year certification card. Cost for the afternoon CPR certification is \$35 and includes a card. The department is also offering a Basic First Aid class from 9 a.m. to noon, April 12. The cost is \$25 and includes a book and 2-year certification.




